

Dear Parents/Carers,

#### Welcome Back!

A warm welcome to our Y3 children and their families and to our new children throughout the school - you have settled in well to the routine of SWJS and you have made a great start to the school year!

Thank you to the parents who were able to attend the Y4, Y5 & Y6 Parents Welcome meetings - we feel these meetings are an ideal time to meet your child's new teachers; to learn about the standards of work expected in their new year group; know the homework timetable and how you can support your children in their new year group.

There will be a special parents meeting in October so that the Y3 parents can meet with the Y3 Teachers again - we do hope that you come along and see how your child has settled in at SWJS!

We will be holding more formal parents evenings in November for the whole school, these meetings will explain how your child is progressing. We do hope you will support us with these meetings as we have a strong, positive partnership with our parents which we believe is paramount to our children's learning and success.

#### Safeguarding notice:

In line with new safeguarding regulations, we have been advised to ensure that we have more than one emergency contact per child in school. Also, if there is a member of the family/ close family friend who regularly 'drops-off' or collects your child from school, please ensure that we hold their emergency contact details too. Thank you for helping us keep your children safe.

#### Attendance/Term Time Holidays

As you know good attendance is very important in school. There is a strong correlation between attendance and making good progress in school - this was evident in last year's Year 6 tests. However, at the end of last year, nearly one quarter of our school children had an end of year attendance lower than 95% - which is considered poor.

Already there have been days this term when we have only had 96%/97% of the school in. This causes concern for those children who require support with their education as well as them settling back into their curriculum and playing 'catch-up' with the lessons they have missed.

Term Time holidays have become a concern for the school: our Attendance Policy states that term time holidays will be considered by our Governing Body and now states that any <u>term time holidays over 10 days will</u> <u>be referred to the Local Authority</u>. Good Attendance is positively promoted within school: not only is it important for learning but helps to foster good working ethics for the future. Please ensure that you encourage good attendance with your child/ren. Please support us with good attendance - thank you!

If your child cannot attend school, it is extremely important that you contact the school office by 9.30am. The preferred method is via the Parentmail App.
