Online Safety updates

You may already know and be aware of a new sinister 'challenge' on YouTube and YouTubeKids. Please be reassured that if this topic does come up in class, the teachers will deal with this in a sensitive, age-appropriate manner. The main actions we can do as parents/ teachers to safeguard and protect our children are: 1)Tell the children that it's not real 2)Be present with them whilst they are playing on their devices so that you can be there to check the content and have appropriate parental settings applied 3)Talk regularly with your child about online safety and what to do if they come across content which makes them feel worried or scared.

I have posted a poster from the National Online Safety group on our Twitter page which will give you more information. I have also recently posted four more posters from the National Online Safety group for parents informing you about Top Tips for parents for Snapchat, WhatsApp, YouTube and Instagram. We hope you find these useful!

Roadworks

I have been informed that between 4th-15th March, resurfacing works will begin on Ocean Road. There will be traffic lights in place on Ocean Road and at times there will be road closures on the junctions of Mikasa Street, Amphitrite St and Strathmore Avenue. During this work, please remind the children to cross these roads safely and use the crossings, the islands and the crossing patrol to help them.

Health Audit

Last term we asked our school nurse to complete a health audit. There were many areas to celebrate: our children drink a good amount of water; our children are active for at least 60 mins each day; and our children know who to turn to if they are worried. However there were some areas we need to work together on, in order to ensure that our children grow up to have happy & healthy lives. A few areas of concern were: the number of fizzy drinks and energy drinks the children drink regularly; children's packed lunches; the amount of time our children spend on electronic devices and how this affected the number of hours of sleep they had. Our school council have been working on a project to aim to improve the snacks we eat in school and are currently investigating the 'health' of our packed lunches. Once they have completed their research, they are hoping to send out the information via a newsletter.
